

Clauses are the building blocks of sentences. A clause must have at least two things:

a subject the topic of the sentence; often, the person or thing doing the action a verb a word that describes an activity, movement, or state of being

e.g.  $\frac{Odysseus}{S} \frac{travelled}{V}$  to Ithaca e.g. so that  $\frac{sales}{S}$  would  $\frac{increase}{V}$ 

Although all clauses have a subject and a verb, they usually contain a lot of other descriptive words, too. There are 2 types of clauses:

express a full thought are complete by themselves, i.e. they are express only part of a thought

e.g. Peanut butter is high in protein.

e.g. Salt raises the melting point of ice.

e.g. Lemurs are native to Madagascar.
